Presenters

Elizabeth Burnside, MD, MPH, MS FACR, is a professor of radiology specializing in breast imaging for cancer screening and associate dean for team science and interdisciplinary research at UW-Madison School of Medicine and Public Health (SMPH). Dr. Burnside combines her medical training with her interests in public health and computer science—areas of expertise that converge in her development and use of computational methods to improve breast cancer decision-making. Dr. Burnside is a multiple principal investigator (MPI) of the NIH Clinical and Translational Sciences Award that supports the UW Institute of Clinical and Translational Research (ICTR), where she is executive co-director. Previously, Dr. Burnside served UW's Department of Radiology as vice chair of research and then vice chair of health services and outcomes.

Anna Wilson, BA, BS is a two-time survivor of ovarian and endometrial cancer. She has been the oncology research coordinator for Marshfield Clinic's Western region, covering Rice Lake and Eau Claire since 2018. In 2024, Anna applied for and was accepted to participate in "Communicating Evolving Cancer Information Innovation Lab", sponsored through the NCI and NIH. Through this program, Anna was able to work with other cancer researchers to develop a research proposal: "Understanding the role of evolving information in contributing to the spread of mammography myths and misconceptions." The NCI awarded Anna's group the funds necessary to complete this research protocol. In the summer of 2025, Anna was appointed as a Patient Advocate for the NRG Oncology group.

Zhi Wen, MD, PhD is an Associate Research Scientist in the Center for Precision Medicine Research at MCRI. He graduated from Central South University, China, in 2000, with a medical degree. His early career involved work on sexually transmitted infections and teaching Medical Microbiology at Central South University from 2000 to 2004. His clinical background not only provided patient care expertise but also allowed the translation of basic research into clinical practice. Dr. Wen recognized the pivotal role of animal studies in translating bench discoveries to clinical applications and initiated his training in mouse models at the MD Anderson Cancer Center and Biodesign Institute after his PhD training by Dr. Ahlquist at the University of Wisconsin-Madison. Dr. Wen is currently conducting translational studies of multiple myeloma and breast/gynecologic malignancies. His research is supported by the Ebenreiter Award, Small Project Fund and the start-up package from MCRI. He is the study section member of ASH foundation and reviewer of multiple high-impact journals.
